Discussion on Sunday Gym Use

Jeff Holzhauer:

- What exactly is the Sunday Policy and why was it put in place? Was it a philosophical or financial decision?
- Friday nights are game nights and Saturday's are off days. We cannot practice on Sundays because of the policy.
- All Lorain County districts with the exception of Firelands and North Ridgeville allow Sunday gym use.

Bert Fitzgerald:

- Baseball is currently 8 games behind this year due to weather. Having the ability to practice or play games on Sunday would be very helpful.

Gary Kincannon:

- We did not practice on Sundays when I was young, but times are changing.
- Would like to offer my support of Jeff in hopes that Sunday gym use will be granted.

David Sokolowski

- I have four kids and volunteer my time as a youth coach. Not many people contribute their time and money for kids to practice at other facilities. Having the ability to practice here would be helpful for the volunteers as well.
- I would rather have my kids practicing here and working with the coaches than on their own or at another facility potentially creating bad habits.

Tony Stefan:

- I participated in adult leagues years ago, that allowed me to network and meet many people I know today.
- Allowing Sunday gym use would provide a great opportunity for kids to practice to get better and exercise as well.

Rocky Houston:

- The kids will be supervised by their coaches.
- I believe kids would utilize Sunday gyms if available.
- We should allow our youth to utilize our great facilities that our community is paying for.

Lisa Mealwitz:

- Used to have Sunday gym use at previous school district and did not have pay to participate fees either.
- Kids go to splash zone on Sunday and pay to use their gyms.

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Bill Ash:

- If the reason for this policy is philosophical, I would like to know why and what is it?
- All we did when I was a young, was play sports. Kids now have gotten away from that
- If parents said their kids would not be able to make it to a Sunday practice, the coaches would understand.

Michelle Compton:

- The weather in NE Ohio is terrible.
- Oberlin, Wellington, Vermilion all played double headers this year on Sunday to make up games.
- Sunday gym use would help all programs.

Greg Morgan:

- I have coached for 29 years. As a coach, parents have been asking for this because it will benefit their kid.
- Don't understand why Sunday is any different from any other day of the week.
- The cost savings is not significant.

Mike Walsh:

- I coach at Elyria Schools and they allowed us to practice on Sundays and it is not abused.
- Regional games are played on Mondays and having the ability to practice on Sunday would be helpful.
- The idea is not to practice every Sunday, but when necessary.
- Some districts have rules that allow it after 1:00 p.m. and the coaches honor family and/or church excuses.

Matt Devore:

- I have younger kids who would like more gym time because they want to get better.
- Jeff Holzhauer, and other coaches, want this because it is best for their kids.

Rachelle Strader:

- I have teenage boys who are a handful. It is really important for them to be at school and have the ability to work off energy.

Brad Campbell:

- Haven't seen school maintenance personnel at Penfield until last year. Volunteers put in a lot of time getting the fields ready.

Ethan Sokolowski:

- I currently pay to use gym an elsewhere. This would be free to students.
- Sundays would be extra time to get work in to improve.

Jim Piazza:

- No one here takes issue with allowing Sunday gym use.
- It bothers me that kids pay to play on Sundays at other facilities when they could practice here at no cost to them. Kids will figure out a way to play or practice, why not let them practice here under our supervision.
- St. Joseph, Elyria Catholic, and Holy name are all religious schools that all play on Sundays.

Chad Elliot:

- Please don't get confused by thinking there are hidden agendas. Everyone proposing this truly wants this for the kids.

Renee Mezera:

- Not sure where the philosophical belief came from. In 2014, the Sunday gym use and 8 pm restrictions were put in place for purely cost savings measures.
- Coaches must be on site so the kids are supervised.

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Dennis Walter:

- Rules need to be put in place for Sunday gym use.
- I am not sure why baseball or softball Sunday use on a field is not allowed.

Franco Gallo:

- It is difficult to tell one sport they can practice on Sunday's because they practice outside and another sport they cannot practice because they practice indoors. All sports have been treated the same, and the policy has been enforced that no sports practice on Sundays.

- 1. Bids were solicited for the middle school building envelope remediation work (Project), and only one bid was received in the base bid amount of \$315,000.00, which was below the published estimated cost for the work.
- 2. Mays Consulting & Evaluation Services, Inc., the Board's design professional for the Project, reviewed the bid submitted by Akron Fireproofing Company, Inc., evaluated the bid for responsiveness to the specifications, evaluated the bidder for its ability to perform the specified work, and recommends that Akron Fireproofing Company, Inc. is a responsible contractor to perform the specified work.
- 3. The Superintendent recommends that the Board authorize the Superintendent to enter into an agreement with Akron Fireproofing Company, Inc. to perform the specified work for the Project in the amount of \$315,000.00.

- 1. The Board awards the contract for the middle school building envelope remediation project to Akron Fireproofing Company, Inc., as the lowest responsible bidder for the specified work.
